

### NEW THIS YEAR - Join us for Lenten Lunch 'n Learn as part of Lent 2025

Lent is the 40-day period leading up to Easter that marks the journey of Christ to the cross. It is a time to reflect on our faith, both in belief and practice. Some may choose to fast from common indulgences such as sweets or meats. Others choose to spend the time honing their faith practices in prayer, Bible study, and giving. This year during Lent, CCTV is offering an opportunity to reflect on our faith through a series of lunchtime lectures. These Lenten Lunch 'n Learns will take place on most Thursdays during Lent from noon until one in the Fellowship Hall. The program will have the option of a brown bag lunch for \$6. Reservations are not required to attend the program but ARE required to reserve a lunch. You are invited to bring your own lunch if desired. Week one will include Victoria's famous chicken salad sandwiches, and reservations can be made on Sundays in the Narthex each week, at the sessions a week in advance, or by calling the church office. Featured speakers and programs include:

#### March 6: The Passion Narrative through Art

Led by Pastor Katie, this lecture highlights famous and lesser-known pieces of art that have been inspired by Jesus' journey to the cross.

#### March 13: The Passion through Music

Enjoy a sampling from the buffet of musical examples inspired by The Passion of Christ from Bach to Parton with Marjorie Stephens, CCTV member and retired Area Coordinator for Voice/Opera at UT.

March 20: Stories of War - Faith Amid Suffering This session will include a panel discussion on how faith informs our suffering and how suffering affects our faith. Panelists include: Anne Cloud (US Airforce flight nurse), Mavis McLean (British Royal Airforce nurse), and Mike Kitchens (founder of Smoky Mountain Service Dogs), and moderated by Scott Duncan (Grief Share Leader).

### March 27: Hoping for Spring - Spiritual Renewal after Winters of Doubt

Led by Rev. Dr. William McDonald, chair of Religion and Philosophy and Associate Dean of Humanities and Fine Arts at Tennessee Wesleyan University. This lecture examines two church fathers from the past, Martin Luther and John Wesley, as they dealt with spiritual doubt and anxiety.

### April 3: Women in the Passion Narrative

Led by Rev. Ingrid Schalk, retired from Our Shepherd of the Lake Lutheran Church, this lecture highlights the role of women during Jesus' final days.

### April 10: A Dramatic Retelling of the Passion

We prepare our hearts for Holy Week with a dramatic reading of monologues written by our own Debra Thompson and performed by various church members.

The Lunch n' Learn series is open to the greater Tellico Village community, so bring a friend or neighbor. May our Lenten journey be enriched through the company of a suffering Savior.

# CCTV Disaster Recovery Mission Trip

CCTV Mission Outreach plans to continue our efforts to help our neighbors recover from Hurricane Helene's disastrous floods. The damage was extensive and our assistance is needed now and in the months to come. CCTV's first opportunity is to work with **Holston Habitat for Humanity in upper East Tennessee** where over 1,100 homes were damaged or destroyed.

- WHEN: Monday, March 31 Thursday, April 3, 2025
- WHERE: Upper East Tennessee (Washington or Carter County) work site will be determined by Holston Habitat for Humanity
- WHO: CCTV members who are interested in helping to rebuild homes that were damaged by flooding. Skills needed include light construction, painting, electrical, or other building skills. We will also need some "floaters" to run equipment to other workers or go pick up additional supplies. Work sites will be supervised by a certified Habitat for Humanity foreman. Jerry and Lisa Noeth are serving as our coordinators for this mission trip.
- **COST:** \$150/person (double occupancy); \$300/person (private room) includes 3nts lodging, meals & transportation to/from work site

# Bearing One Another's Burdens

### "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ." – Galatians 6:2

One of the greatest gifts of Christian community is that we do not walk this journey alone. Life brings seasons of joy and celebration, but also moments of hardship and loss. As your pastors, we are here to walk alongside you, to bear one another's burdens, to pray with you, and to remind you of God's steadfast presence—especially when life feels uncertain.

### But sometimes, folks hesitate.

- I didn't want to bother you.
- I wasn't sure if this was serious enough to call. I didn't want to be a burden.

Let me say this clearly: If you are struggling, you are never a burden. If your heart is heavy, if life feels overwhelming, if you need someone to pray—that is exactly why we are here.

So, people often want to know when they should reach out.

### **Call Your Pastors When...**

- You are confronting a crisis. If you or a loved one is hospitalized, if you are experiencing grief after a loss, or if a significant life event has shaken you—call.
- You need spiritual guidance. If you're wrestling with questions of faith, facing a tough decision, or shouldering a burden you can't bear call.
- You are getting ready for a major life transition. Whether it's a move, a significant change, or another milestone—you don't have to face it alone. Call.
- You need prayer. Whether it's before surgery, during a difficult season, or simply because life feels heavy—call.
- You are feeling isolated or discouraged. If life is weighing you down and you need encouragement—call.

# When NOT to Call Your Pastor (But Someone Else at the Church)

- If you're wondering about the time of next week's event, where to find the bulletin, or how to sign up for something—our church office is happy to help!
- If you need financial assistance, we have a designated process for that. Contact the church office.
- If it's 3am and not an emergency, we love you, but it can wait until morning.

### **After-Hours and Weekend Pastoral Care**

We know that life's challenges don't always follow office hours. If you need to contact a pastor after hours or on the weekend, please call the church number (865-458-1516) and leave a detailed message. That message will be forwarded to the pastor on call, who will return your call promptly.

### We Are Here for You

Being the church means being in this together. Paul's words in Galatians remind us that bearing one another's burdens is not just a suggestion—it's at the heart of what it means to follow Christ. This applies to us as well, your pastors. We do not carry our burdens alone; we bear them together. So, you should do the same.

If you find yourself hesitating and wondering whether it's okay to reach out, let me answer that for you: Yes, it is. Please call. The office is open Monday through Thursday from 9am to 4pm and Friday from 9am to Noon. The office number is 865-458-1516.

# 2024 Missions Giving

Each year a summary of missions giving is prepared and each year the generosity of our congregation grows. In 2024 we gave over \$395,000 to various community organizations, world ministries and scholarships. This represents 22% of our total spending, net of our mortgage.

Where does all this money come from? It comes from you! Through our annual budget that you support, the proceeds of the TVCC Crafters' sales, endowment fund grants, special offerings, and designated gifts.

What are these gifts used for? Everything from providing food for the hungry and power bill assistance to the poor, building affordable housing and making critical repairs to homes of seniors and people with disabilities, serving prison populations and those coming out of incarceration, educating youth through scholarships, and providing funds for disaster relief and recovery.

### **Finance News**

In the fiscal year 2024, as a congregation we experienced a notable financial achievement by generating a surplus of \$89,000. This surplus stemmed from diligent budgeting and effective financial management, coupled with budget under runs that allowed us to allocate additional resources strategically. During the membership meeting on February 9th, it was unanimously approved to allocate the \$89,000 Surplus as follows:
